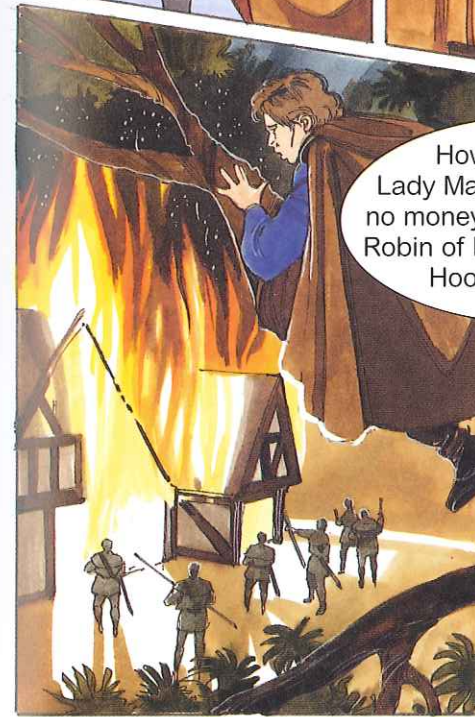
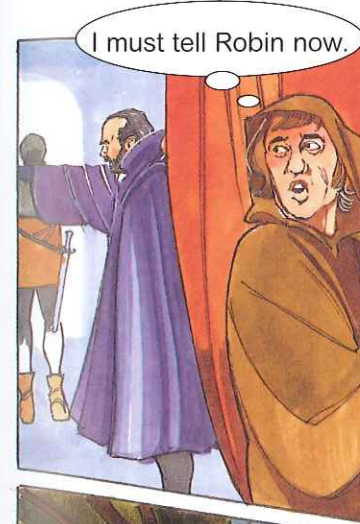
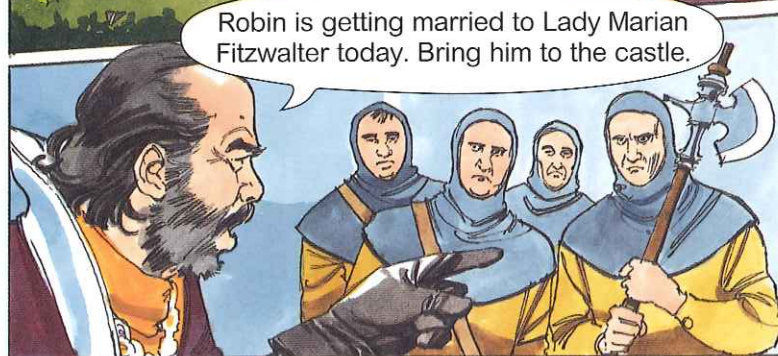
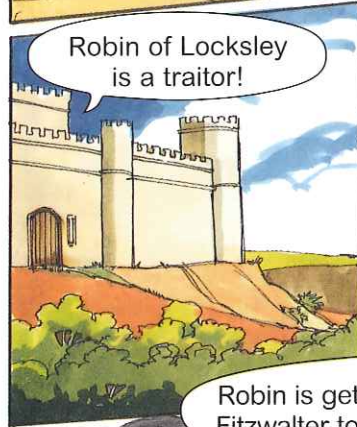
ROBIN HOOD

We must take money from Prince John's bad men. And then give it to our people. They are hungry.



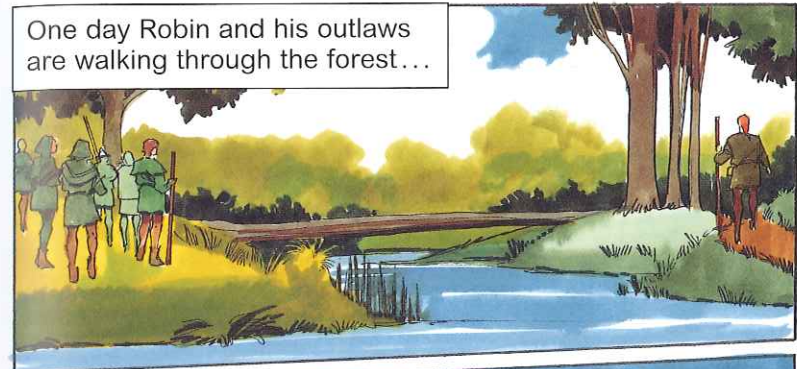
When Robin and his men see a rich man in the forest, they stop him.

No, you wait!

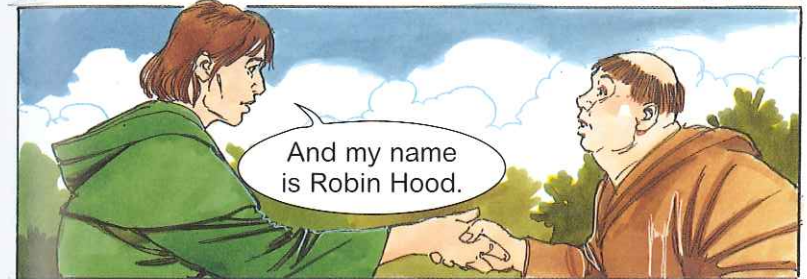
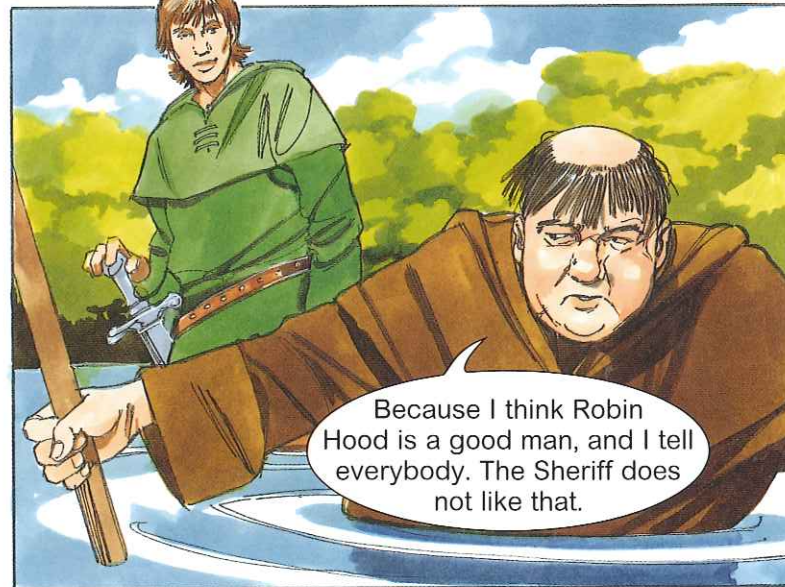

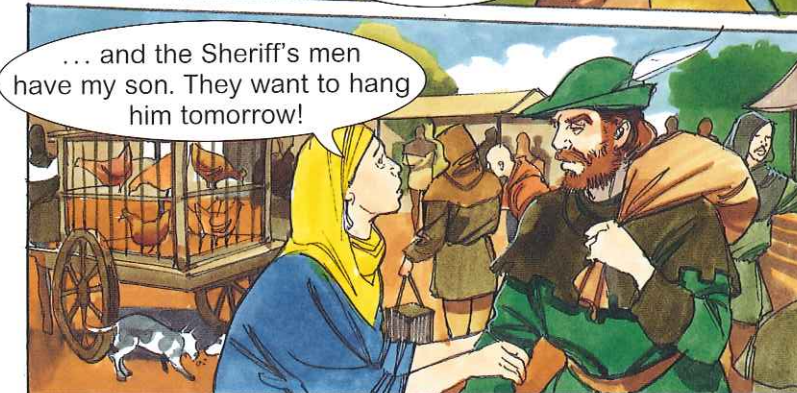






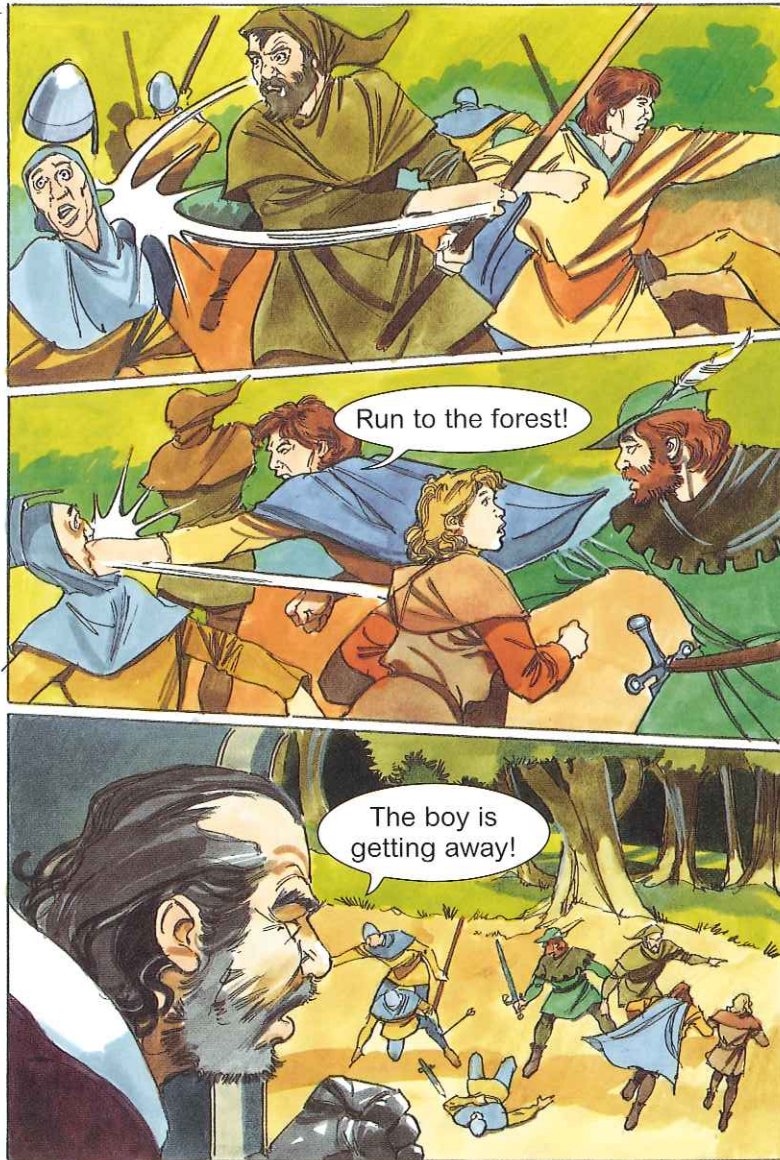


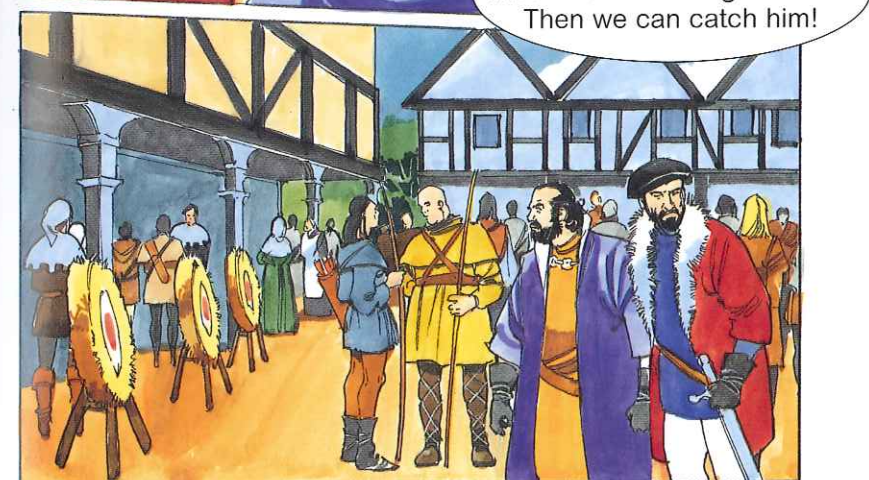
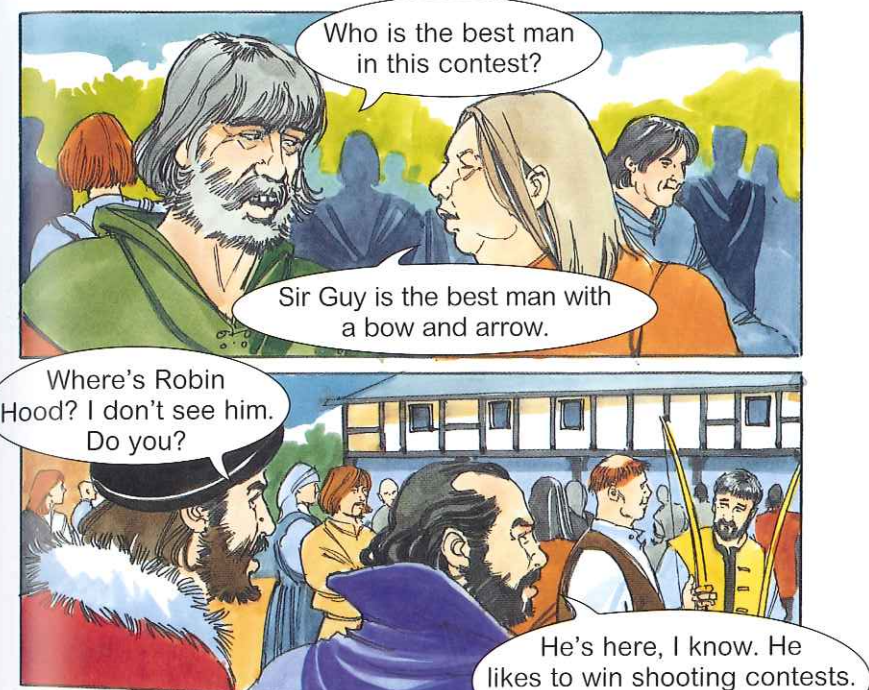
One day, a young boy is hunting in the forest. He kills a deer. But some of the Sheriff's men are watching him...

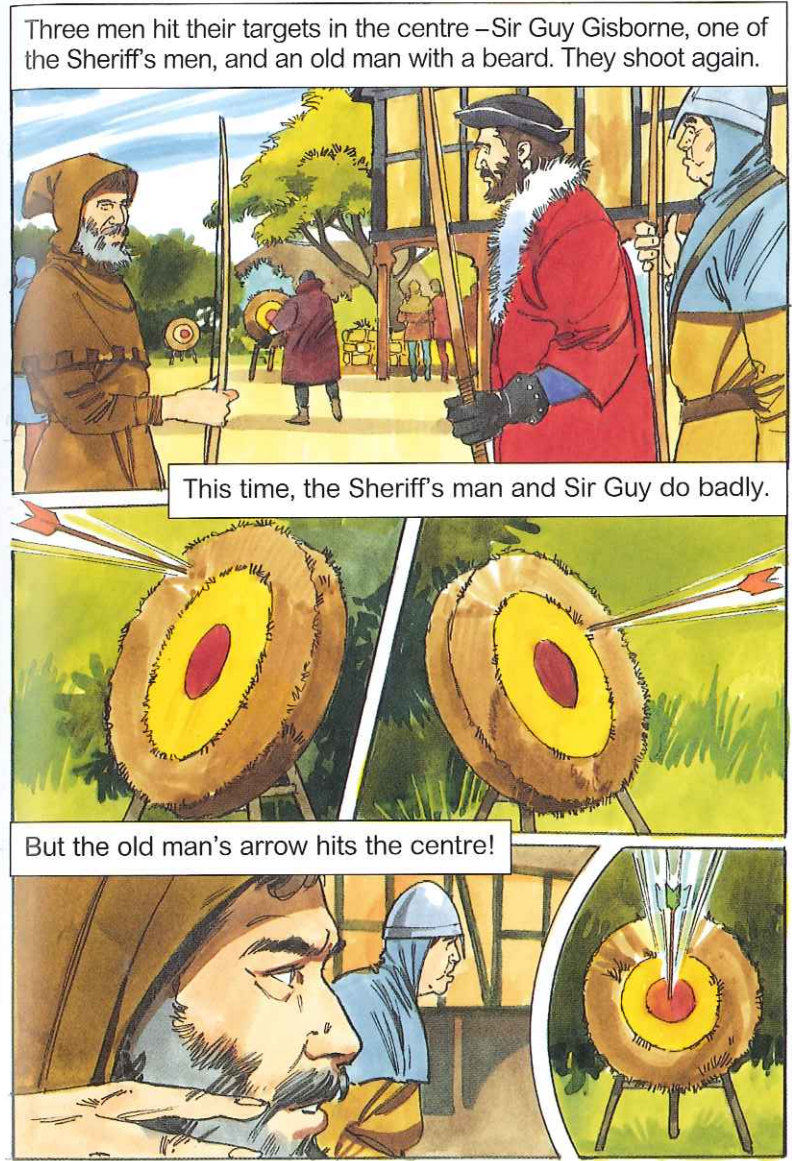
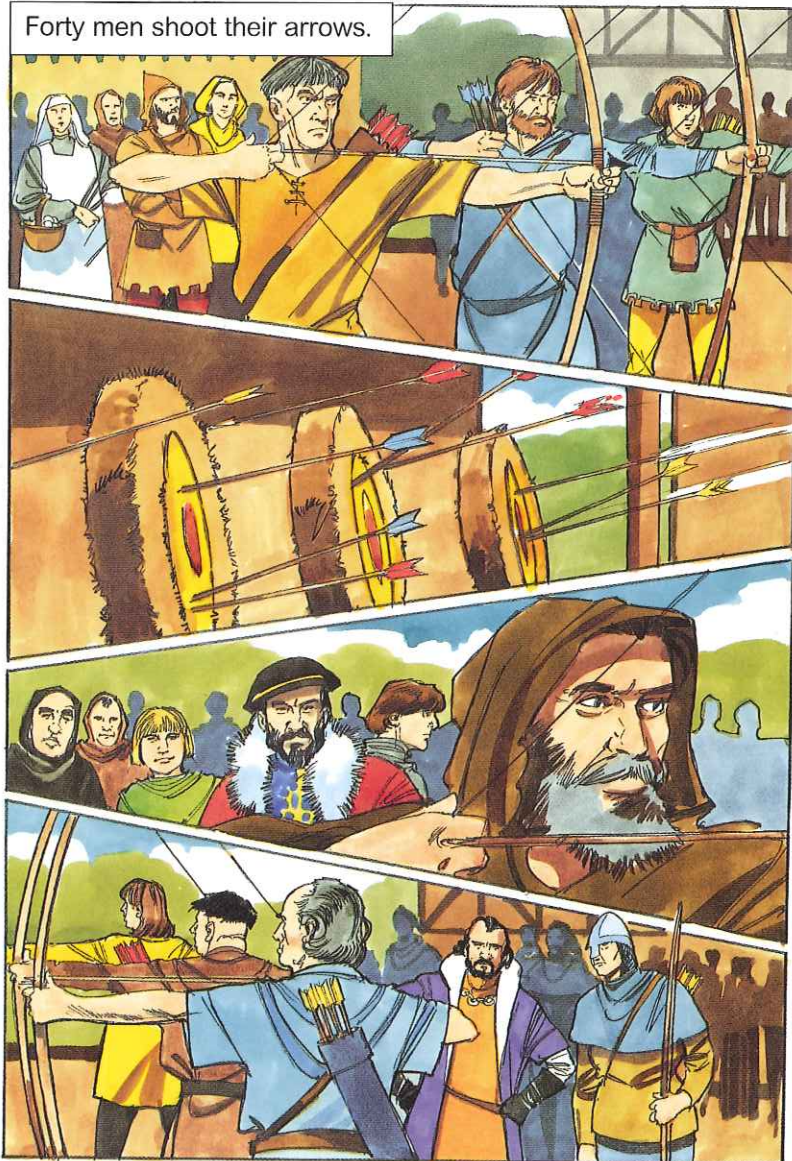


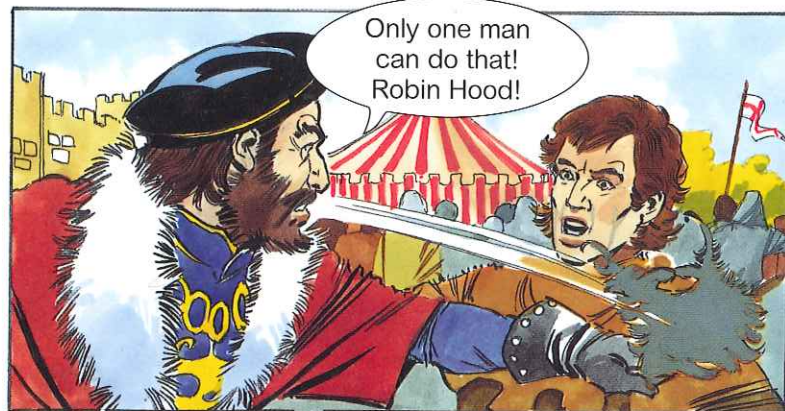
Early the next morning at Nottingham Castle, the Sheriff and his friend Sir Guy Gisborne look down from a castle window...



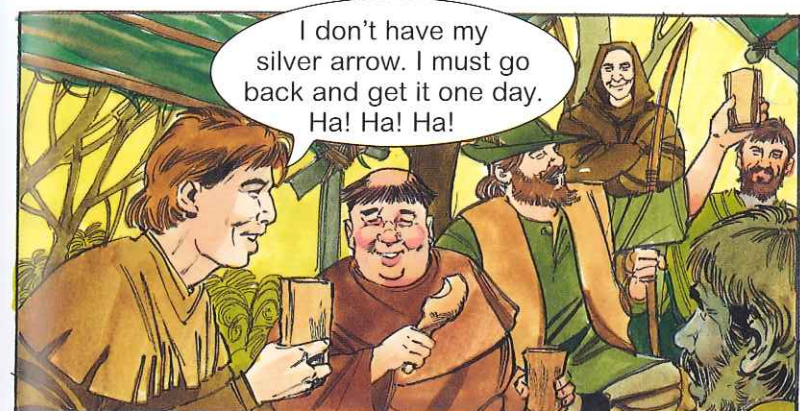








The Sheriff's men are very slow. And everyone wants to help Robin.

I'm looking for Robin Hood.

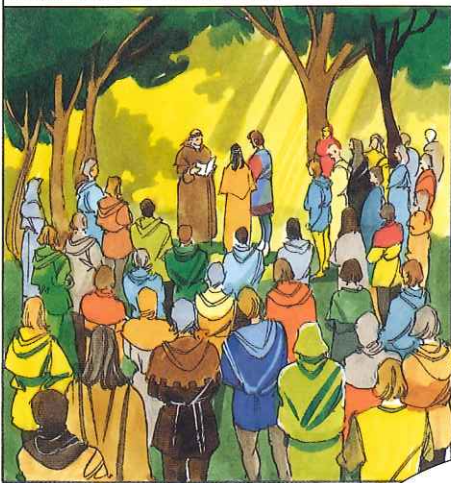


Lady Marian tells Robin about Sir Guy ...

outlaw someone who breaks the law and hides

pay give money to someone for something

prince the son of a king or queen

rich (*adj*) someone with a lot of money is rich

sheriff somebody who stops people breaking the law

silver an expensive metal

summer a warm time of the year

taxes money that the government takes from you

thief someone who takes something that is not theirs

traitor someone who goes against his king or his country

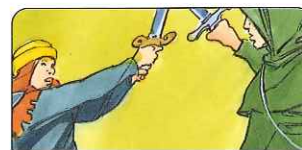
